

Knight Masons in Kansas

The Chapter of Knight Masons are an invitational body for York Rite Masons who are members of a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. The Knight Masons confer three degrees, sometimes referred to as the Irish or Green Degrees, within their Chapter. These are impressive degrees which tell an Old Testament story. The lessons learned in the Knight Masons degrees are an excellent building block for a member of the Holy Royal Arch to continue their journey of masonic

Kansas currently has two Chapters of Knight Masons. Kansas Chapter No. 53 meets in Wichita and Drogheda Chapter No. 68 meets in Shawnee. Each meets four times per year to elect candidates and perform the degrees.

The two Chapters regularly visit each other to assist and to observe the performance of the Green Degrees.

Kansas Chapter traveled to Shawnee to visit and meet with Drogheda Chapter on March 5, 2022, and enjoyed an excellent conferral on new members. Congratulations to the new members of both Knight Masons Chapters.

The Allied Masonic Degrees

The Allied Masonic Degrees are an invitational organization, and requires membership in the Royal Arch as well as the Symbolic Lodge. Membership is limited to 27 members per council. Kansas currently has three Councils of the Allied Masonic Degrees. They are Loch Lomond No. 235, Sunflower No. 383, and Blarney Stone No. 360. Each Council meets quarterly to confer some of the older degrees which are no longer being held or conferred by other masonic bodies.

The Allied Masonic Degrees confer the Royal Ark Mariner, Brotherhood of David and Jonathan, Saint Lawrence the Martyr, Grand Tilers of King Solomon, Knight of Constantinople, Master of Tyre, Excellent Master, Architect, Grand Architect, and Order of the Secret Monitor.

These degrees are beautiful and preserve a history of masonry which is sometimes forgotten due to time and loss of a body to hold and confer the degrees.

Grand Lodge Update

The 166th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Kansas was held in Topeka, Kansas on March 18 & 19, 2022. It was an exciting time of fellowship and education. There was an education presentation by the Kansas Lodge of Research given by Companion and Sir Knight Alex Powers. York Rite College

The York Rite Sovereign College of North America has one College in Kansas, that being Kansas College No. 125 which meets in Newton, Kansas. The York Rite Sovereign College of North America exists primarily to be of service to the York Rite of Freemasonry. Constituent colleges must declare fealty to the Grand Lodge of their respective jurisdictions. The pre-requisite for membership, which is by invitation only, is to be in good standing in all four York Rite bodies: Lodge, Chapter, Council, and Commandery.

Kansas College No. 125 met on February 19, 2022, at the lodge hall in Newton to confer the degree. A wonderful lunch was provided by the Jobs Daughters of Newton before the conferral commenced. The degree conferral was both impressive and beautiful and was done by the sitting officers for the College. After the completion of the degree, the College elected and installed their officers for the ensuing masonic year.



Masonry is work and it is that work which makes both the Mason, and all he interacts with, better for having been together.

HRAKTP? What does that even mean?

Masons are used to seeing "alphabet soup" when they hear about the various masonic bodies in the United States. There are ROOS (Royal Order of Scotland), RCC (Red Cross of Constantine), YRSCNA (York Rite Sovereign College of North America), and many more too numerous to mention here. There is one which seems to have such a long string of letters as to confuse those who are not familiar with it and its history. That is the HRAKTP (Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests).

The HRAKPT, sometimes referred to as Knight Templar Priests or KTP for short, is an honorary and invitational only body. Its membership cannot be applied for. Members are selected and extended invitations based on their exemplary service while serving as a Commander of a Commandery of Knights Templar.

The Order has its roots in England and started in 1786. There are some references from as far back as 1686, which has been listed as the traditional year of revival of the Order. This Priestly Order was conferred in the High Knights Templar in Ireland in 1755. There

have been records purporting the Order to have been conferred in the United States in the 1800s, however there is not a certain manuscript proving that.

The HRAKTP selects the number of Tabernacles in each state based on the number of Commanderies located in that state. Each constituent Tabernacle is limited to only 33 members each.

There are currently three Tabernacles operating with the Grand Jurisdiction of Kansas. These are All Saints Tabernacle LVI in Kansas City, King David Tabernacle LX, in Salina, and River Jordan Tabernacle XXXVIII in Wichita.



York Rite Spotlight

This issue spotlights the York Rite Bodies of Kansas City, Kansas. The bodies held there are Wyandotte Chapter No. 6, Wyandotte Council No. 6, and Ivanhoe Commandery # 21.

They meet at the Old Mission Masonic Center at 5201 West 75th, Prairie Village, KS 66208.

The bodies meet at 7:00 PM on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday. The 1st Tuesday is Commandery, 3rd Tuesday of the odd months is the Chapter, and the Council meets on the even months.


The Chapter was established in 1866, the Council in 1908, and the Commandery in 1883.

The Kansas City bodies are unique because they have a member who is a Past Grand Master of Masons in Kansas, Past Grand High Priest, and a Past Illustrious Grand Master. The member is our esteemed Brother and Companion, Jimmie Grassi, Sr. This is quite a unique honor for any York Rite Body to have in their midst.

The Knight York Cross of Honor

The Convent General, Knights of the York Cross of Honour (KYCH), was formed in Monroe, North Carolina on March 13, 1930. Membership in the KYCH cannot be applied for. Candidates must have served as the Master of a Symbolic Blue Lodge, High Priest of a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, Illustrious Master of a Council of Royal and Select Masters, and a Commander over a Commandery of Knights Templar. Potential members are proposed to the order at a stated communication of the KYCH. Candidates must not only have served their constituent bodies, but they must have served with distinction to be recommended and considered for membership. Serving as the presiding officer alone is not enough for membership.

Kansas has one Priory of the Knights York Cross of Honor, that being Kansas Priory No. 33 which holds its meetings in Topeka. The Kansas Priory meets twice per year. The first meeting is to consider and elect qualified candidates for the Order. The second meeting is to confer the Order upon those who have been elected to receive the honor.



Red Cross of Constantine

The Red Cross of Constantine is officially referred to as the Masonic and Military Order of the Red Cross of Constantine and the Orders of the Holy Sepulchre and St. John the Evangelist. Membership in the Red Cross is by invitation only for those who are members of a Royal Arch Chapter and are of the Christian faith, as revealed in the Old Testament of the Bible. The bodies are known as Conclaves. Membership in each state is based on the number of Royal Arch Masons in good standing within each state.

Kansas has five Conclaves. They are St. Augustine in Topeka, St. Justin in Kansas City, St. David in Salina, Calvary in Wichita, and Crispus in Pittsburg. These Conclaves meet at different times in their respective meeting places to elect members, confer the orders, and have discussions centered around masonic education as it relates to the Red Cross of Constantine.

Rosicruciana

The Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis (SRICF) is a masonic body which has a special place in research and Christian study. While the SRICF is sometimes referred to as a York Rite appendant body, it is technically not. Membership in the SRICF is held by Master Masons who have made a statement of Christian faith.

Kansas has one College and it meets in Shawnee quarterly. The body has a total of nine grades, and cannot be applied for. Membership is granted by invitation only. The first seven grades are conferred by each College. The eighth and ninth grades are conferred by the national body at its annual meeting.

A College of Rosicrucians meets to discuss concepts related to the Christian faith and esoteric concepts related to the mysteries of the Christian religion. It is predominantly a research body and publishes an annual journal of research done by its members throughout the preceding year.


Interested in Joining the York Rite?

Who were the Knights of Malta?

The Order of the Knights of Malta took control of the island in 1530 and continued to rule and govern the island until 1798. The Knights of Malta continued to improve the living conditions for the people living on the island of Malta. They provided a merchantbased trade commerce for the island and erected hospitals to treat the sick and infirm. In 1676 a school of anatomy and surgery was founded. The Knights of Malta established Jesuits College on the island in 1592 and later became the University of Malta. The Knights of Malta built strong fortifications to protect the island and its inhabitants from oceanborne invaders. The Knights of Malta eventually lost control of the island in 1798 when Napoleon Bonaparte's army conquered the island and removed the Knights of Malta. This was an incredible defeat for the Knights of Malta. They had survived being besieged for many months by the Ottoman invaders during the Great Siege of 1565, yet the French army easily removed them from power. This was due to the Knights of Malta underestimating the strength and resolve of the French army. They made no preparations for the force of power the French army possessed, and the island of Malta became controlled by the French.

During the first few days of the French occupation, several changes were put into place by the new French government. Slavery was abolished and all Turkish slaves were ordered to be freed from their bondage. Napoleon created an education system which provided for primary and secondary education among the inhabitants of the island nation. Napoleon ordered a more scientific-based university to replace the university which was already in place on the island of Malta. This new civil code was enacted to make the nation more prosperous and to educate its people in the way the French educated their own people.

Once Napoleon had been removed from power, the British took control and management of the island. They ruled Malta for over 160 years. During their time Malta was bombed repeatedly by the German army during World War II, however they were unable to conquer and invade the island. The German government wanted to control Malta because of its significance to commerce in the ocean and because it held a strategic position between the two warring nations. The island was granted its sovereignty in 1964 and continues to rule and govern itself, people, and affairs as a sovereign nation.



The York Rite of Freemasonry

The York Rite, or more correctly, the American Rite, is based on the early remnants of Craft Masonry that were practiced in the early 1700's. The formation of the first Grand Lodge of England in 1717 specified that the lodges were to confer only the first three degrees of Craft Masonry.

Three bodies were later formed to work the degrees no longer controlled by the lodges. The Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, Council of Royal and Select Masters, and the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar. All three bodies are technically autonomous Masonic entities, only the requirement of membership in the Royal Arch connecting the Cryptic degrees and Chivalric Orders together.
