Recently I read a book written by a retired Navy Seal, Admiral William H. McRaven, "The Hero Code." It might as well been titled "The Masonic Code." He uses ten words to expand his thoughts and experiences to "The Hero Code." First I want to quote his condensed synopsis:

1. I will always strive to be **COURAGEOUS**; to take one step forward as I confront my fears.
2. I will work to be **HUMBLE**; to recognize the limits of my intellect, my understanding, and my power.
3. I will learn to **SACRIFICE** by giving a little of my time, my talent, and my treasure to those in need.
4. I will be a person of **INTEGRITY**; every decision I make and every action I take will be moral, legal, and ethical.
5. I will be kind and **COMPASSIONATE** to at least one person every single day and expect nothing in return.
6. I will never give up on matters that are important to me, my family, my country, or my faith. I will **PERSEVERE**.
7. Whatever job I am given, whatever **DUTY** I am bound by, I will do it to the best of my ability.
8. I will use my unique talent to inspire others to give the **HOPE** that tomorrow will be a better day.
9. I will use **HUMOR** to comfort others, and never be afraid to laugh at myself.
10. No matter how great or small the offense against me, I will try to **FORGIVE**. I will be the victor, not the victim.

Each of these ten words are equally a part of Masonry. Every day a Mason should take time to reflect on these ten works. I am sure it will make him not only a better Mason, but a better man. Each day we are faced with challenges. Take time to reflect before reacting and you will be surprised at the results. In today's fast moving work we seldom put this into practice.

I reflected on these ten words and found INTEGRITY to be a combination of all the others, but more important, it is the summit of a man and a Mason. Integrity is hard, very hard. Following what you know to be right, the rules, and the law is hard. Why? It is easier to be well liked among your Brothers, it is easier to go along with others, it is easier to get along with others, and it is hard to fight against your natural tendencies. Yes, integrity is hard!

Because good and evil are always present and in conflict, because you are human, and the things in life more often than we want force you and me to be put in untenable positions, it is hard. Yes, we fail occasionally, but when we fail to uphold our integrity, we may have sleepless nights or be sick to our stomach. Yes, integrity is hard!

What makes a man a Mason, or maybe a hero, are their struggles and their ability to overcome those struggles. 




MARK MASTER

Take part in this historic opportunity to see the degrees performed in full form with Master Masons who have a genuine interest in learning more about their Blue Lodge degree history experience.




# Council Cliff Notes

For this article I would like to talk a little bit about loss. My Masonic father, the man who recruited me into the Lodge, died on January 16, 2023. Craig Stallwitz showed up at my home in 1995 with a petition and said, "You are going to join the Masonic Lodge No. 365 in Derby." So I did, and that started a very interesting trip through Masonry.

My York Rite mentor Bill Manning died on November 11, 2022. He was always willing to help you learn your degree work and Templar Order parts. We spent many hours at the old church building with Bill teaching me the floor work for the Twelve Man Inspection and the Order of the Temple. Bill got into the grand line for the Commandery and asked me to be his appointment to the line. Unfortunately, he had to drop out of line when this wife, Helen, came down with dementia. SK Dave Bingham was kind enough to carry out Bill's wishes and appoint me to the line.

In 2017, I asked Dennis Taylor to be my Standard Bearer and he eagerly started his journey through the Grand Commandery line. I looked forward to installing him as the Grand Commander of Kansas in May of this year, but it was not to be. Dennis died on January 28, 2023.

If you are an active Mason and travel around Kansas and the United States, you meet many men who will become acquaintances and friends. Your circle expands and your life becomes richer. I would probably never have met the three men I talked about above if not for Masonry. My life was made better by knowing them.

I would like to close this article with the Circle of Friendship. If you do not attend the Grand Council session, you may never experience it.

*We have learned that the Circle is emblematical of Friendship. Let us now close our ranks, standing shoulder to shoulder, with arms crossed, and hands warmly clasped, thus welding the Circle of Friendship into an unending chain of fraternal union.*

#### A PROCLAMATION FROM THE MOST PUISSANT GENERAL GRAND MASTER

WHEREAS, the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation was incorporated in March, 1986; and

WHEREAS, from 1996-2000 the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation fully funded an endowed Chairmanship at the Indiana University Medical Center, first held by Dr. Keith March, and now currently held by Dr. Michael Murphy; and

WHEREAS, since 2012, the Indiana Center of Vascular Biology and Medicine, chaired by the CMMRF endowment, has been a part of the Cardiovascular Cell Therapy Research Network, funded by the National Institutes of Health, opening the door for further grants and ability to research; and

WHEREAS, the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation is currently researching treatments for abdominal aortic aneurysms, arthritis, cancer, diabetes, heart failure, pancreatitis, peripheral arterial disease, and stroke; and

WHEREAS, CMMRF has created a marrow stem cell treatment of limb ischemia for patients with severe peripheral arterial disease trail which has reduced the need for amputation, the sixth most expensive surgery in the United States; and

WHEREAS, in its first four decades, the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation has given the University of Indiana School of Medicine over \$5.4 million and seen that investment return a remarkable progress in the extension of human life; now, therefore be it hereby

PROCLAIMED, by the Most Puissant General Grand Master of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International, as March is the anniversary month of the incorporation of the CMMRF, that March 2023 be designated as "CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION MONTH," and be it further

PROCLAIMED, by virtue of the Grand Master's signature hereunto appended, that each Grand Council and constituent Council under the jurisdiction of the General Grand Council, is encouraged to make a special donation to the CMMRF during the month of March, as their support contributes to the lifesaving measures being undertaken at the University of Indiana.
