

The Masonic Order of Pilgrim Preceptors



The Order is based on the story of how Freemasonry came from Jerusalem to England.

Candidates are admitted to the degree of Pilgrim, which describes the journey of Freemasonry from Jerusalem to Rome. The second degree is that of Preceptor, and explains the journey from Rome to England. The third degree is the Installation into the chair as an Illustrious Preceptor. The ethos of the Order, and its motto, is "Fraternity, Equality and Liberty".

Membership is by invitation, and members must be subscribing Past First Principals of a regular Royal Arch Chapter under the Supreme Grand Chapter of England or in amity therewith and subscribing Past Masters of a regular Craft Lodge under the United Grand Lodge of England or in amity therewith.

This group meets at Masonic Week each year in Alexandria, Virginia. There has been some interest in bringing this Order to Kansas and have the conferrals annually at the Grand York Rite Session.

Upcoming AMD/Knight Masons Ingathering

The third annual AMD/Knight Masons Ingathering will be held on Saturday, October



12, 2024, at the lodge hall in Newton, Kansas.

The morning will start with the conferral of the Knight Masons degrees starting at 9:00 AM by the three Councils of

Kansas College No 33, KYCH Conferral

It can be argued the highest honor a York Rite mason can receive is to be inducted into the Knight York Cross of Honor. This is a special ceremony provided only to those elected to receive the honor. In order to be nominated for this honor, the individual must have served with honor as a Past Master of a Blue Lodge, a Past High Priest of a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, a Past Illustrious Master of a Council of Cryptic Masons, and a Past Commander of a Commandery of Knights Templar. It is not enough to have simply been installed into those offices. The individual must show they have worked to attain the honor.





On Sunday, June 2, 2024, at the lodge hall in Independence, Kansas, five new Kansas Masons, and one member from Oklahoma, received the honor.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the officers for 2024-2025 were elected and installed into their respective offices.

Congratulations to those who were elected to receive the honor and to those who have been installed to work for the College for the next year.

The History of the Island of Malta

The island of Malta had great significance for the Knights of Malta. Malta was the island the Apostle Paul landed on after the shipwreck discussed in the New Testament of the Holy Scriptures. Paul was bitten by the viper while on the island. These are some of the reasons behind the Knights of Malta viewing the island as a holy place.

Malta is approximately sixty miles south of Sicily and is eighteen miles long and eight miles wide. Malta is an extremely old island with a rich history. Malta has been inhabited for over 8,000 years. There are remains of structures built by the earliest inhabitants of the island. These structures include Neolithic temples, which were erected almost 1,000 years before the pyramids at the Giza plateau in Egypt. They are believed to be the oldest free-standing construction still in evidence in the entire world.

The island was conquered by the Phoenicians, Carthaginians, Romans, and Arabs. These groups saw a value in bringing the island of Malta under the control of their respective nations. Not all the invaders pillaged and destroyed the island. During the Byzantine-Arab wars, the invading Arab faction introduced irrigation techniques, fruits, and cotton to the island and its population. The Arabs brought the language of Sicily to the island. This language has changed over time and become the modern-day Maltese language. The Arabs allowed the Christian population of the island to continue to worship as they liked, however they were taxed at a higher rate as a repercussion, and this was a discrimination because of their religion. The Norman conquerors seized the island of Malta in 1091 and were welcomed by the Christian population. The Christians were happy at the takeover and saw this as a way for the Roman-Christian religion to be set as the state religion for the island.

The Order of the Knights of Malta took control of the island in 1530 and continued to rule and govern the island until 1798. The Knights of Malta provided a merchant-based trade commerce for the island and erected hospitals to treat the sick and infirm. In 1676 a school of anatomy and surgery was founded. The Knights of Malta established Jesuits College on the island in 1592 and later became the University of Malta. The Knights of Malta built strong fortifications to protect the island and its inhabitants from oceanborne invaders. They eventually lost control of the island in 1798 when Napoleon Bonaparte's army conquered the island and removed the Knights of Malta. This was an incredible defeat, and they had survived being besieged for many months by the Ottoman invaders during the Great Siege of 1565, yet the French army easily removed them from power. This was due to the Knights of Malta underestimating the strength and resolve of the French army. They made no preparations for the force of power the French army possessed.

During the first few days of the French occupation, slavery was abolished and all Turkish slaves were ordered to be freed from their bondage. Napoleon created an education system which provided for primary and secondary education among the inhabitants of the island nation. Napoleon ordered a more scientific-based university to replace the university which was already in place. This new civil code was enacted to make the nation more prosperous and to educate its people the way the French educated their own people.

The importance of the island of Malta to the Knights cannot be stressed enough. The island had significant biblical importance for an order founded upon the beliefs in the holy scriptures. We learn in the Acts of the Apostles in chapter 28, Paul was shipwrecked and came ashore to what was named the island of Melita, which is modern day Malta. The name Melita is Semitic and means refuge. Being an island of refuge for Paul made the desire for the Knights of Malta to maintain this island as a place of refuge for their Order.

While there are many reasons for the Knights of Malta to desire to possess the island of Malta, one stands out among the others as more important. Because Paul walked and lived on the island performing miracles and healing during his stay, it made the island an important part of scripture. For an Order founded on the Holy Bible, having their headquarters in a location so closely aligned with the teachings of faith, made the island more desirous for them. Ultimately, they possessed the island and made life better there for the inhabitants.

The York Rite of Freemasonry

The York Rite, or more correctly, the American Rite, is based on the early remnants of Craft Masonry that were practiced in the early 1700's. The formation of the first Grand Lodge of England in 1717 specified that the lodges were to confer only the first three degrees of Craft Masonry.

Three bodies were later formed to work the degrees no longer controlled by the lodges. The Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, Council of Royal and Select Masters, and the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar. All three bodies are technically autonomous Masonic entities, only the requirement of membership in the Royal Arch connecting the Cryptic degrees and Chivalric Orders together.
